## 4.11Constitution

**Philip Gerrard**: In order to establish a new organisation a model constitution has been drawn up with advice form the Charity Commissioner's (CC). The constitution is based on a Model produced by the CC and adapted to suit the purposes of a new deaf sports organisation. The contents have been checked by a solicitor qualified in such matters.

The Constitution con now be accepted in principle and will be subject to amendments at the first AGM to be held **no later than June 2004.**

## New people to include ASAP

Website webmaster Other volunteers Sports Directors of Deaflympic sports Coaches

The DWP will be expecting high qualification standards. Some sports bodies will be used to the criteria expected and it will be new to others. Those not making the standards for Melbourne 2005 will be given support from DWP and UKDS to bring up to standard.

It is expected that teams or individuals being selected for Melbourne will be potential medal winners, standards from GB are not very high at the moment. Most sports will be looking at development of Performance Plans ready for 2009 Deaflympics.

We have less than 18 months before Melbourne 2005

Teams need to be selected and preparation plans executed.

There are a possible 16 sports that could be bidding for places at the Deaflympics

Final decisions will be left with UKDS Management

DWP will be concerning itself with Melbourne 2005, but will be laying the foundations for the 2009 Deaflympics and beyond so that hopefully in 8 - 12 years time we may see new GB sports emerging such as Volleyball etc

Sports Directors of Deaflympic sports will be contacted by letter with regular information exchanges and meetings

July 2003 will be first meeting of the DWP to be hosted by the BDTA at The Queens Club, London. This will be a meeting of the Sports Directors of Deaflympic sports. The meeting will outline what is to be expected of each other. Performance Plans, management Plans and hopefully meet each individual Director to look at their PPs and then go back to work on them with your sport.

The DWP expects the meeting to be a good one

The DWP has already been in discussions with the BPA British Paralympic Association Athens 2004 Manager to discuss her role and learn from her.

The 2006 Commonwealth games could be a possibility for Deaf sports to be represented. The DWP will investigate this

### 12.0 Questions from Delegates

**Helen Thew** (Becoming Visual) **Question**: How will people be contacted to have full information about the standards and expectations of the DWP for Melbourne 2005?

**Chris R**: There will be a letter sent to everyone for information. See me afterwards and I will take your names and addresses.

### Jackie Perkins (Deaf Netball)

**Question**; It would be interesting to know what sports are at the Deaflympics. How can you get a new sport into the Deaflympics? We are interested to have Netball in the Deaflympics.

**Chris R:** There are a number of countries playing netball and there should be no reason why not. However I recommend that you go slowly and build up. You will have to follow CISS regulations and remember that CISS also encourage World Championships and Global region competitions (European etc)

My role will be to focus on Melbourne 2005 only and UKDS Development Manager will work with you for the future.

Christof Niklaus (Fulham Deaf Football)

Question Will there be issues relating to UKDS and the CISS?

**Craig Crowley**: The BDSC are part of the DWP this is to ensure that all CISS regulations and deadlines are met for the Melbourne 2005 Games. BDSC hold the CISS card and this is respected.

At the CISS Congress, it will be BDSC who represent the UK and not UKDS.

There will be two delegates to attend the Congress in Melbourne will this still be BDSC by 2005?

There is still a lot to clarify between BDSC and UKDS but this is a political discussion and will not interfere with the work of the DWP where BDSC and UKDS are working together for Melbourne 2005

### Dean Humphries (Great Britain Football)

**Question** We are going to Spain for the European Championships. Who do we work with: UKDS or the BDSC?

**Chris R**: You will be working with the DWP so in a way it will be both UKDS and the BDSC who are the DWP

This is because the Europeans are preparation for the Deaflympics therefore you work with DWP

I will be writing to you and all Sports Directors to inform you of what is to be expected from you and what is required in your PPs Performance Plans. You will need to demonstrate that your teams or individuals are realistic medal potential. Your Performance Plans (PPs) are very important to DWP

### Gordon Hay (Black Country DFC)

**Question** You mentioned there are possible 16 Deaflympic sports. Will they all be given equal treatment or will there be priority sports?

**Chris R:** All Deaflympic sports will work with the new Development Manager for 2009. You must reach standards to get into Melbourne 2005 There are other sports that are not Deaflympic or CISS (Rugby, Golf, and Netball) you have World Championships etc and will be assisted by UKDS as you are popular sports and can compete internationally but will also need PPs

### Peter Powe (Welsh Deaf Golf)

**Question** We have two Chairmen one is UKDS and other is BDSC how does this work?

**Craig C**: Yes, there are two Chairs (UKDS and BDSC). Glynn Rosser (BDSC and I have been holding talks and writing to each other over all the issues we have discussed today.

Where we have agreement so far is related to the Deaflympic Working Party where Mike Webster is involved as BDSC Secretary to enable the paperwork to be officially recognised by CISS for the 2005 Deaflympics. Teddy Webb is also involved from BDSC with his years of experience as a Technical Director for the CISS and his knowledge of the World Games.

Where we have a difference of opinion is related to the future of deaf sport and the future of the BDSC. This is a political debate and has no bearing on the CISS and Deaflympics.

Glynn and I will continue to have discussions and hopefully we will reach agreements as soon as possible.

What is important to note is that the UKDS will continue it's work as we have been recognised by UK Sport as the body to lead on the Deaflympics and the future of Deaf sport in the UK. The UKDS is the lead organisation for the Deaflympics and goes through the BDSC for administration purposes
