4.8	Mark Perry (British Deaf Tennis Association) suggested that we need to financially distribute the funding into 2 parts. 1 for performance and the other for development CAC replied strategic plans were already in place for Taipei. This year was an exception due to 18 months of preparation for Deaflympics but seeds already sown. Furthermore, Deaflympics Report had made recommendations and this would be highlighted at Special Deaflympic Reception to be held on 24 th October 2005
