4.	TRUSTEE'S ANNUAL REPORT AND ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31 MARCH 2023	
4.1	The UKDS Annual Report and Accounts for the year 2022-23 were received and noted.	
4.2	PM introduced Emma Eldridge from Kings Accountants. EE highlighted the following key	
	points from the Accounts:	
	- An 88% increase in UKDS income from 2021-22, accounts show incoming resources	
	for the year of £446,311, with the majority of the income being core restricted funding from Sport England (SE), with a small amount (£5,819) being unrestricted funds from	
	small donations.	

- The core restricted funds were from SE funding.
- The charities notable expenditure outside of the Together Fund direct to communities, was on staff costs and interpreters.
- SE funding currently presents a surplus, which is the cumulative underspend of funds which has been agreed with SE on how to spend in 2023/34.
- Key focus for 2023/24 and beyond is to increase unrestricted funds to cover expenditure such as interpreters and other costs no longer financed by SE.
- 4.3 JC provided an overview of some of the key points from the Annual Report:
 - Recruitment of new UKDS staff
 - Increase in operational delivery
 - Development of Operational Plans outlining key actions from 2023-27 to achieve the Vision and Mission
 - Impact measures to show the impact of activity on increasing participation rates and deaf awareness
 - Actioning 98 Governance actions to reach Tier 3 compliance with the Code for Sports Governance
 - Completion of some participation programmes including 'See My Voice' and 'Women and Girls Project'
 - Introduction of new projects such as 'Together Fund' and Volunteer platform
 - Supporting 8 Deaf sport organisations to reach Tier 1 compliance with the Code for Sports Governance
 - Deaf Awareness Training, with funding secured for up to 200 learners to complete online training programme

JC highlighted some of the key activity planned for 2024:

- New Marketing and Comms Strategy
- New survey
- New membership offer rolled out
- Supporting more deaf sport organisations to reach compliance with Tier 1 of the Code for Sports Governance
- Exploring commercial partnerships to support deaf sport and Deaflympics
- 'Fair Play for Deaf Athletes' campaign

5. APPOINTMENT OF HONORARY OF PRESIDENT OF UK DEAF SPORT

The Chair asked Members to approve the appointment of Jodie Ounsley as Honorary President of UK Deaf Sport for one year.

The total number of Members eligible to vote was 11 with 5 Members present and 3 proxy votes.
